DESIGN****NEW ORLEANS URBAN INFILL HOUSING COMPETITION**

Judith Kinnard led the CP+D team in the development of a mixed-income urban infill project for a site along the Mississippi River just downstream from the French Quarter. This mid-density proposal serves as a prototype for similar redevelopment areas in New Orleans and includes approximately 160 units of housing, all necessary parking on grade and limited retail and commercial functions. Public spaces serve the housing and provide visual access to a park and the River.

URBAN HABITATS HOUSING DESIGN COMPETITIONS

This innovative housing scheme in Charlottesville, Virginia explored a mixture of market rate and affordable housing units on the site of a current mobile home park. Among the many important accomplishments of this project is maintaining all eighteen families currently living in the mobile homes who will be provided with rental or purchased affordable houses in the newly redeveloped scheme. A Community Garden and Community Center are part of the scheme as is some small scale retail uses for the neighborhood.

NEW URBAN HOUSING, NEW YORK, NEW YORK

Judith Kinnard won second prize in this national design competition for an innovative mixed-use housing proposal in Queens. The scheme mid and high density housing integrated with retail and commercial functions. This is an urban revitalization scheme for Queens, New York, and it includes a strategy for the placement of a big-box retail function in a modified "base" for the housing. Atop this large function are the units of housing and a generously scaled public garden overlooking the East River.



COLDSPRING NEWTOWN/CYLBURN ARBORETUM NATIONAL DESIGN COMPETITION

In collaboration with Kenneth Schwartz, Judith won this national design competition for 600 units of housing and a new plan for the City of Baltimore's Cylburn Arboretum. Through a strategy of streets and public squares the scheme integrated urban and landscape qualities for this hillside site overlooking the Inner Harbor in Baltimore.

HILLSIDE HOUSING DESIGN COMPETITION Cincinnati, Ohio

This small scale infill housing project was developed as a prototype for comparable, environmentally sensitive sites in Cincinnati. Judith won first prize in collaboration with her team including Kenneth Schwartz, Warren Byrd ASLA, Susan Nelson ASLA, and Neal Peyton AIA.
